# iOS 12 - Interface and Gesture Basics

Page 1

“Home Button” is disappearing

With iOS 12 the following gestures will work on devices with or without a “Home Button”

Single press on the “Lock Button” will lock the device - press and hold to shut it down

On “Lock Screen” you can swipe left to view your Today View

Swipe down from top right corner to view Control Center - this works all the time not just lock screen

On lock screen swipe right to left to open the camera. To return to home screen you must swipe up from bottom of screen

To view “Notification Center” from the “Lock Screen”, swipe up from center of the display

Once phone is unlocked, there is an information bar at the top of the screen showing time, date and what services are available as well as the battery status

Page 2

On the bottom of the device the “Dock is displayed. On the iPad up to 15 apps can be displayed. The apps in the Dock don’t change so you should have the ones you use most often there.

You may have several “Home Screens” indicated by the dots just above the Dock. Swipe left to right to go to the next screen - or visa versa. Swiping up from the bottom of the display will take you back to the first page of the home screen.

Swiping all the way right-to-left gets you to your “Today Screen” as well as to a search bar located at the top of the screen. You can also get to “Spotlight “search by swiping down from the middle of any “Home Screen” page

Single tap on an app to launch the app

In an iPad when in an app, swipe up from the bottom edge to bring up the Dock. From here you can launch a different app or add an app in “Split View”

Swiping from the lower righthand corner on the iPhone gets you to the “App Switcher”

# iOS 12 - Notifications

## Global Control

Too many notifications can become annoying

To get to the “Notification Center”

- When locked swipe up from screen center
- When unlocked swipe down from top

What’s displayed can be different in each place depending upon “Notification Settings”

Display choices can be altered by going to “Settings” -> “Notifications”

First up is a global “Preview” option to determine what is shown in a notification

- “Always” shows a couple of lines of info,
- “When Unlocked” - shows the same as above, but when locked shows no preview info
- “Never” - displays that there is a notification but offers no preview content

# iOS 12 - Notifications

## Individual Control

Each app's notifications can be individually controlled. Chose an app in the Notifications Settings.

- On the top you can see that you can turn notifications for the app on or off. If you elect to leave them on, you can chose what style/s are displayed as well as what sound (if any) accompanies the notification.
- You can also turn on or off Badges.
- Further down, "Previews" can again be controlled on an app by app basis
- Lastly is the area where we can set how often a given notification repeats at 2 minute intervals. Your choices are none to 10 times.

Most times taping on a notification will take you directly into the app that sent the notification.

- Swiping from left to right on the notification allows you to "Clear" "View" or "Manage" the notification.
- "Manage" allows you to deliver future notifications "Quietly" (no sound, banner, or badge) or completely turn them off until you restart them in notifications settings. Conversely, one can chose to "Deliver Prominently" from a "Quiet" notification.

# iOS 12 - iPad Multitasking

One can have 2 apps displayed at once - “Split Screen”

Add second app from dock - Drag above open app and hold for a second

You can also drag from dock onto an “App Switcher” app

Drag divider between apps to adjust to your liking

When switching to a new app from Split Screen, BOTH previous apps go to App Switcher as a pair

Clicking on one of those again from the dock brings back both

If one wants to replace one app (of two) displayed, just drag the new app's icon over the old one and hold for a moment - then release

To close either app from Split View, drag the dividing line from between them off the screen

# iOS 12 - iPad Drag and Drop

## iPad Drag and Drop

You can move text images, links and more

With 2 apps open in “Split View” one can select, then drag and drop to the other app

Don't have to be in “Split View” - You can select in one open app and drag to a second app in the dock and drop it appropriately

One can even select more than one item at a time to drag (but not yet from web page)

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
