The next generation of sound on Apple Music is **coming to subscribers** June 2021
at no additional cost

Apple announced Apple Music is bringing industry-leading sound quality to subscribers with the addition of Spatial Audio with support for Dolby Atmos. Spatial Audio gives artists the opportunity to create immersive audio experiences for their fans with true multidimensional sound and clarity. Apple Music subscribers will also be able to listen to more than 75 million songs in Lossless Audio – the way the artists created them in the studio. These new features will be available for Apple Music subscribers starting in June at no additional cost.

What's the difference between USB-C, Thunderbolt 3, Thunderbolt 4, and USB 4

- USB C describes a connector, not a communication standard
- Thunderbolt 3, Thunderbolt 4, and USB 4 **all** use the USB C connector
- The difference between Thunderbolt 3 and USB 4 is purely in name - the standards are identical
- Thunderbolt 3 and USB-4 can operate at either 20 or 40 Gigabits per second depending upon the device they are plugged into
- Thunderbolt 4 **always** operates at 40 Gigabits per second
- Safest to purchase Thunderbolt 4 cables - works with all device standards
- Thunderbolt 4 also includes support for USB and DisplayPort, if you see the Thunderbolt logo – **a small lightning bolt and the number four** on the cable – you know that connection can do it all.

On 8 June 2021, Amazon will flip the switch on [Amazon Sidewalk](#), an experimental mesh network that uses Amazon devices to **share small amounts of YOUR bandwidth with each other**. Unfortunately, although you have a choice as to whether your Amazon devices will participate in Sidewalk, compatible Amazon devices are opted in automatically. You can turn this off!
