


Which Outstanding iPad Model Is The Right iPad For You?

Entry Level iPad

It sports a 10.9-inch display and 64GB of storage. You can upgrade to more storage if necessary. The design has been refreshed and resembles a higher-end iPad Air, but the starting price has increased to \$449.

The A14 processor is more than capable of handling iPadOS 16 and future updates for some time. In addition, it can do almost anything a senior could need.

iPad Mini Model



Consider the iPad Mini, which is 7.7 inches and weighs slightly over a half pound. iPadOS 16 makes it a powerful computer and beats watching video on your iPhone.

Where it's fantastic is as an ebook reader. There's no better iPad for kicking back and enjoying a good book.

You can add a click on keyboard to turn it into a mini laptop.

The only downside I can see is the 8.3-inch screen; you'll need some decent eyesight, and at \$500, it's a bit on the pricey side. If you're looking for a good e-reader, pick up a Kindle for far less.

iPad Air Model



The iPad Air offers some pro-like features but is more affordable than the iPad Pro. It has a 10.9-inch screen and a speedy M1 processor making it ready to take on anything from watching a video to playing games and even writing that novel you've been putting off.

It supports Stage Manager and external displays. In addition, the USB-C port lets you plug in Mac accessories like external hard drives.

If you've been using the base model iPad and are ready for a better model but not needing the Pro, the iPad Air may suit your needs.

The drawbacks are it costs a bit more. Almost twice as much as the 10.2-inch iPad. So be sure you need the additional capabilities.

iPad Pro Model

If you use the iPad for your primary computer needs, this is an excellent reason to choose the iPad Pro. It's Apple's most prominent and best-looking display.

It uses Apple's powerful M2 processor. That's right, the same processor inside the latest Mac. It has performance power on par with Apple notebooks—maybe not the MacBook Probut still pretty impressive.

iPadOS 16 is more straightforward than macOS, which makes it easier to use and beneficial for seniors.

The M2 iPad Pro's USB-C port can connect to almost any accessory a Mac can. Plus, there's Thunderbolt support for high-speed file transfers.

This model comes in two sizes.

11-inch iPad Pro



People buy the iPad Pro models because it offers the very best performance. In addition, the 11-inch iPad Pro provides a more portable design than its larger sibling. So if you expect to take your iPad with you, this might be your chosen version.
